Legislative update: Mike Schissel gave a report on happenings at the MN legislature. He said there have been 6 bills by the house with additional bills by the senate adding up to more than a dozen. First is RED FLAG law where anyone judged mental cannot possess firearms. In the House will be moving to the Senate. Then, no more than 10 round magazines, Universal background check for all firearm transactions. John Marty Roseville and one from Mpls want to require all gun owners to register firearms, have mental health check and physical check, only Purchase 1 firearm in 30 days, No carry on government property, and any private business could restrict firearm on premises. Bills still in committee. Hopefully won't go anywhere. Hopefully House will not pass it and Senate is more friendly to gun owns so he does not see these bills going anywhere Gun caucus trying to push Stand your Ground bill. Going to be a tough year some discussion followed by members present. Mike is impressed by the actions by the Minnesota Gun Caucus taking place. He is going to get the recent OGC members of the gun caucus to look at the actions taking place in their area and make their voice heard.

The money in Bayport. Daryll believes there is a need for long range planning Director. OGC should be looking ahead 5 and 10 years.

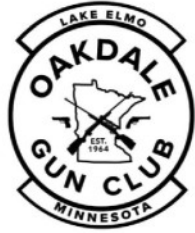

2022 Introduction to Firearms for Women

Do you want to learn about handguns, rifles and shotguns?

This 1 evening + 1 day informational workshop, taught by certified safety instructors, is a way for Women to get their basic questions about firearms answered in a safe, friendly, casual, women-only classroom environment.

Note: Instructors are both Female and Male.

The workshop consists of one evening and one full day: evening is classroom discussion and Saturday morning is “hands on”. Then experience an afternoon of live fire range time on Saturday afternoon. You do not need to have any previous shooting experience to take this class or own a firearm.

A wide variety of firearms will be provided at no extra cost for those who wish to try them during the range session. This course neither promotes the ownership of firearms nor will any be offered for sale during the course. This class is open to the public. You must be at least 18 years of age to take this class, unless accompanied by a parent. Other restrictions may apply.

The cost of this course is \$50.00 (includes: class materials, firearm rentals and ammo) and must be prepaid to hold your registration. The class is limited to 30 women on a first come basis.

This class is only held once a year.

The 2022 Class has been scheduled.

Wednesday April 27th from 5:30pm to 9pm in the classroom at OGC

Saturday April 30 th 9:00am-5:00pm-from 9:00am-12:00pm “hands-on” in the classroom with lunch 12p-1p (you may bring your own or leave for lunch) then 1:00 pm to 5:00pm shoot one-on-one with instructors on the range.

You must attend both Wednesday evening and Saturday’s morning class to be able to shoot on the range Saturday afternoon.

Three Position Rifle Matches

These matches develop proficiency in firing for score in the sitting, kneeling, and standing positions. Any repeating rifle, rim fire, or center fire qualifies for use, There are no requirements or limitations to equipment. Any sight, any action, any modification is allowed. The challenge is for the shooter to excel in these positions which is typically not dependent on equipment at the amateur level. The match is comprised of 50 rounds at 50 yards; 10 rounds slow and rapid fire sitting, 10 rounds slow fire kneeling, and 10 rounds slow and rapid fire standing. Low velocity jacket or cast bullet reloads are suggested for reduced cost and recoil. Score your own targets. Brag to your friends and family and vow to do better next match. Because this is an "any gun" match, there are no competitive classes. Rotate between different guns during the season if you wish. Matches are the first and third Wednesdays, May through September (May 4, May 18, June 1, June 15, July 6, July 20, Aug. 3, Aug. 17, Sept. 7, Sept. 21) . Open practice at 5:00 PM, match starts about 6:00 PM and last about an hour. Match fee is \$5. In the event of inclement weather (snow, rain, or muddy range conditions as the result of heavy rain), the match will be cancelled. For more info. about the match or cancellations.

A Challenge to try a New Shooting Experience

You've seen the club's calendar and various shooting events that are offered, in our gun club newsletter. One of those events is called CBA Benchrest. The CBA stands for the Cast Bullet Association. And although the match rules require the use of cast bullets, that rule will be relaxed for ANYONE who wants to give it a try.

The events are held on (3) Mondays each summer. They start at noon and are over around 3:00. The shooting season will get going again in May 2022. So grab your favorite rifle, 60-70 cast OR jacketed bullet loads and plan to experience a whole new shooting experience. Use a bolt action, lever action, pump, break open, single shot rifle, etc. Iron sights or a scope. The typical \$15 match fee will be waived for first time shooters. During the match, as you do the shooting, you will be coached about the match and equipment rules. They are not complicated. We only shoot 100-yards, from the shooting bench.

Blue Hills Sportsman's (Rice Lake)

Resist seeing this as a competition. There is no pink Cadillac in the parking lot for the "winner". These events are borderline social as much as they are shooting fun.

A brief look back

The exact time period escapes me but there was a time when the Club's Technical Director, Dick Larson, would put on brief informal presentations starting at 6:30, before the general membership meeting. The subjects varied but they were always interesting.

Dick was a small arms consultant. He worked for Honeywell and travelled the world, helping countries and arms manufacturers improve their ammunition manufacturing capabilities.

Two of his presentations for us club members, are a couple of things I often reflect back upon.

The first involved his visit to a European arms manufacturer. As his host was walking him through the facility, he drew Dick's attention to a wall of the building. The host pointed to a large dark area on the wall. The host said to Dick "you are looking at all that's left of Hans. He was moving a cart of priming compound through the area and it went off. That dark smear on the wall is Hans". That story of Dick's left me with a deep appreciation for the compound used to make the primers that many of us hand loaders take for granted.

The second was his description of the vibration characteristics of a rifle barrel as the powder is ignited and the bullet is moving down the barrel. Dick said that if you could slow everything down and isolate your view of the barrel, he said "it would look like a fat lady pulling on a girdle" (sorry ladies).

Dick had many interesting topics that his "small classes" discussed. They included bullet design, cast bullet vs. jacketed bullet, powder burn rates, primer selection, scope adjustments, revolver design, hunting bullet performance, military ammunition vs. commercial ammunition, etc. It was a lengthy list of interesting subjects and those in the audience were the beneficiaries of Dick's willingness to share his knowledge.

Dick has long since passed. I'm thankful I was there.
