OGC July Member Meeting Minutes

OGC Member Meeting July 13th, 2022

Meeting started at 7:00 PM by Pres. Tom Mader.

Pledge was said.

There were 21 members present.

Toilets: Gale, Big congratulations to Gail for all her work on the toilets. They are ready except for door security access. It has taken about 3 years to complete with Gale monitoring all that happened.

Trap Cost: The Executive Committee has met and recommend price increase for trap.

Daryll presented data from other clubs and the price they have:

The cost of a case of birds to us is now \$15.37 per case.

Also, to be considered is the number of rounds shot per case and breakage and spillage. There was much discussion about the cost increases and what input we need to look at to set the prices. The Board will set the price at the Board meeting.

AC in house: The AC in the house has failed. The furnace is old also. We are looking at replacing the AC and the furnace.

Restroom Access: There will be member badge access for the door when not open to the public. When open to the public there will be a switch like the classroom door to keep the access door unlocked.

RSO Scheduling: 217 available slots for members and will keep adding slots for new members. About 80% filled for members and 64% for new members filled. About average for where we were last year at this time.

Public Address System: the club purchased a audio system several years ago and it is not being Used. The system is obsolete but still works. The Board needs member approval to sell.

Motion made to sell the PA system. Seconded majority of members present voting aye.

ADA Work: Herb has talked to Troy who is waiting on materials with the hope to complete by July or August. Items needing to be done are Parking area adjacent to 200,

trap lanes millings spread; Comp range millings spread. Need to install walkway by trap and dirt work on trap building. Teresa has put signage on ranges. Need to fix the lip onto the concrete pad on the ranges. Teresa would like to have a committee of members to get little things done for ADA.

Picnic results: Prizes cost was under \$1500. Attendance was down 20%. Great Job done by Shauna and Byron Patterson.

Drawing: voted to have two drawings of \$10 each. Winners were #10 Jim Schaefer and #4 Shauna Peterson.

Archery Range: Declan Schultz Eagle Scout proposal to build Archery range.

Dollar amount so far from member's donation is \$300. There had been interest

from a few members and a few new members. Would need parking area and

land for the range. There needs to be expert info for building a range. The Eagle Scout

would have to design and build the range. There would need to be ADA access for the range and an addition to the special use permit from Lake Elmo. With this info the Board considered the proposal, and a **vote** was taken with all voting no.

Tom apologized to Herb Owen and Dean Cody on the letter he sent to them and the Board on this issue.

Future proposals to the Board would need to have more information.

Open Trap Director position: Tom Mader recommends to the Board to hold this position open until the Annual meeting. There is nothing going on now with trap. Tom indicated he had 6 members ask about the position.

Motion was by Tom to hold the position open for now.

Vote was taken with all voting ayes.

Tom Grezek letter on the range conditions: Discussed what needs to be done to keep the ranges orderly and clean. Teresa indicated that even with a daily clean up it only lasts until

several people use the range and don't clean up after themselves. The ranges are for the members and the members need to clean up when they are done.

Jack will monitor video to see when member leave their junk on the range and don't clean up after themselves.

Pictures on range: Jim Schafer was present to ask about taking pictures on the range. He would

Like to take pictures on the ranges of matches etc. and build an album of OGC activities.

He asked about having a photo release form to allow picture taking.

Mike Schissel, Gail Angone and Tom Etzel will work with him to present at next Board meeting.

Trap Building: Establish plan for use of the Trap building to control the items stored in the building. Dean and Daryll will work out a policy for storage. Conduit still needs to be run but will be for next year. Also, some grading for water problem needs to be done.

RSO Video Update: Tom would like to have video of Teresa's RSO presentation done.

Tom got 5 responses from the newsletter. He will use 3 of the respondence chosen by Tom to work on the RSO presentation.

Gift Certificate: Teresa is working with the current POS system to create a gift card that can be any denomination to be used for ammo, membership or other. Teresa will have something for the next Board meeting.

Trap Fees: Discussed the cost increases of Birds for trap.

Current price for Birds for members is \$13.00. Dean indicated he would like to raise cost to at least \$17.00 per case due to price increase, also a round of trap would be \$5.00 for member and \$10.00 for public. Discussion followed on Board input on the prices. The Board tried to take into consideration the cost of shooting on all the ranges. Teresa indicated we spend a lot of money on chicken wire to shoot on other ranges as opposed to cost of maintenance on the trap machines. There also is a cost of breakage and spillage on birds. **Motion** was made to

price a case of birds at \$17.00 for sale to the members. Motion passed.

Next **motion** to increase the cost of a round of trap at \$5.00 for members and \$10 for non-members.

All present voting aye.

An Eblast will be sent out to indicate that the trap cost increases will take effect August 1.

Bylaws: Reminder that Bylaw amendments must be submitted in September.

Tom indicated there needs to be adjustments made.

AC house: Dean has gotten 4 bids for Air conditioning in the house. Refrigerant had leaked out and due to the age of the unit it could not be fixed. After discussion on the bids he received, APOLLO was chosen with a bid of \$11,200.

Motion to adjourn 9:05 PM Meeting adjourned.

Your 2022 Scholastic Action Shooting Program - State and Nationals Update

The Hudson Raiders Shooting Club would like to thank the Oakdale Gun Club for allowing us to use the 25-yard range for our practices. Eleven athletes participated on Friday afternoons, throughout the spring and summer. Eight athletes competed at the SASP Wisconsin State Match in Saukville, Wi and six athletes traveled to the Cardinal Shooting Center in Marengo, Ohio for the 2022 SASP National Championships.

Some of you may have seen the range occupied by this group and wondered what we are all about. SASP describes itself as "An organization that provides student athletes, aged elementary through college, with a supportive environment where shooting sports serve as catalysts for teaching life lessons and skills that emphasize positive character traits and citizenship values." The fun part is that kids get a chance to learn firearm safety, develop their marksmanship skills and learn the sport of action shooting. Our kids compete in rimfire pistol (22LR-iron sites), iron riffle (22LR-iron sites), optics rifle (22LR-RedDot optic), PCC (Pistol Caliber Carbine | 9MM), and 1911 (.45 or smaller caliber - iron sites). Next year, there will also be an option to add rimfire revolver as a new discipline.

An official SASP match (like Steel Challenge) consists of the best 4 out of 5 strings on 4 different courses, for 16 strings added together for a total time. Courses are set in different configurations with 5 steel plates of various sizes at set at various distances. The athlete must hit 4 plates, followed by a stop plate (5th plate) as fast as they can.

Courses this year included: Focus, In and out, Go Fast, Speed Trap, V for V, and Exclamation. Additional courses are in the works for next year!





The word is spreading through the Hudson Raiders Shooting Club and interest in SASP is growing. Next year, we look forward even more kids wanting to enjoy action shooting. For more information, please contact the Hudson Raider Shooting Club at https://doi.org/10.1007/journal.com


