There will be budget meeting by the Board to closely monitor our spending. **Pres: Tom Mader**: Discussed the idea to participate in Armstrong Ranch events. It was mentioned that the event is geared toward pheasant hunting and would not be any benefit to us. It was decided to pass on working any events there.

Assemble crew to set up and takedown. Provide final \$ accounting.



#### 2022 Introduction to Firearms for Women

Do you want to learn about handguns, rifles and shotguns?

This 1 evening + 1 day informational workshop, taught by certified safety instructors, is a way for Women to get their basic questions about firearms answered in a safe, friendly, casual, women-only classroom environment.

Note: Instructors are both Female and Male.

The workshop consists of one evening and one full day: evening is classroom discussion and Saturday morning is "hands on". Then experience an afternoon of live fire range time on Saturday afternoon. You do not need to have any previous shooting experience to take this class or own a firearm.

A wide variety of firearms will be provided at no extra cost for those who wish to try them during the range session. This course neither promotes the ownership of firearms nor will any be offered for sale during the course. This class is open to the public. You must be at least 18 years of age to take this class, unless accompanied by a parent. Other restrictions may apply.

The cost of this course is \$50.00 (includes: class materials, firearm rentals and ammo) and must be prepaid to hold your registration. The class is limited to 30 women on a first come basis.

This class is only held once a year.

The 2022 Class has been scheduled.

Wednesday April 27th from 5:30pm to 9pm in the classroom at OGC

Saturday April 30 th 9:00am-5:00pm-from 9:00am-12:00pm "hands-on" in the classroom with lunch 12p-1p (you may bring your own or leave for lunch) then 1:00 pm to 5:00pm shoot one-on-one with instructors on the range.

You must attend both Wednesday evening and Saturday's morning class to be able to shoot on the range Saturday afternoon.

Eighteen hardy souls braved single digit temps and (thankfully) little wind on Feb. 19 for the 16th annual Frozen Chosen rifle match on the 100y range. A wide variety of guns sent lead downrange. Joining the M1 Garands were a Finnish and Russian Mosin, M1 Carbine, Swiss K31, AR-15 and an HK. For as cold as it was, the shooting was not that bad. Quite a few scores in the 400s. John Possehl was the match winner with 449 out of 500 with his Finnish Mosin.

### A little history related to the Frozen Chosen: **The Battle of Chosin Reservoir.**

This a Korean War battle that took place between 27 Nov. and 13 December, 1950. This was early in the war (which began in June 1950). This match @ OGC began (2004) as a commemorative event to recognize the efforts of the forces of the United Nations, which included US Army and US Marine forces. The match is conducted in cold weather, usually February, replicating the weather conditions seen during the battle, and match shooters are encouraged to use rifles that were used by American forces during the battle. Many shooters use the M-1 Garand rifle with .30-06 ammunition and no scopes are used, just iron sights.



# Some early handgun silhouette match history at OGC

At my first OGC meeting in the Moose Lodge @Frost and English streets, April 1978, Jack Reece, the President at the time, listened to a subject introduced by members Rich and Wendy Rudman. They had heard about a new shooting game sweeping the country. The game was handgun silhouette. The targets were the same as those used by NRA Highpower Rifle silhouette but at shorter distances. Luckily, the longest handgun shooting distance could be accommodated on the OGC 200-yard range.

The game started in Mexico, the NRA adopted it and started shooting rifle silhouette matches in Arizona. A group of shooters in the SW thought it would be a good thing to adopt the game to the use of handguns. These people formed the IHMSA (Intl. Handgun Metallic Silhouette Association) in 1976.

Jack Reece asked the Rudmans to look into it. They did. And along the way, Keith Purdie, who was connected to Gopher Shooter's Supply in Faribault, also got interested in the new game. He sourced a set of (40) targets and donated them to the Minnesota Handgun Silhouette Association. These targets were shared by several clubs. This Minnesota association was patterned after the IHMSA organization. This Minnesota activity happened in 1978.

In 1979 the steel target support frame seen today on the OGC 200 range was erected and was moved back to 200-meters. The preferred IHMSA shooting distances are 50, 100, 150 and 200 meters. OGC could accommodate meters in 3 of the 4 distances. We could not move the 100-yard target line back, so OGC had to live with 100-yards, not meters.

The first OGC match was held in 1979. At a match a "stat office" is required. At this match it was Jim Mottaz's (OGC member) motor home. In subsequent years it was the old granary. The little shack on the hill behind the 100-yard line was way too small to serve this need. Shooters bought their score cards there, had their guns weighed, barrel lengths checked, sights reviewed and dry fired to check for too sensitive of an action. After the shooter was done shooting, his score card(s) are turned in here.

In the early 80's there were matches held at these clubs: Oakdale Minnetonka (up near St. Francis) Thief River Falls (a 7-hour drive from OGC!) Brainerd Rochester Duluth Virginia Harris Fergus Falls

# Some early handgun silhouette match history at OGC (Cont.)

The interest was quite intense. At the first Minnesota State Championship, Keith Purdue twisted a few arms at Gopher Shooter's Supply to agree to sponsor the match and have enough door prizes so every shooter received a gun. I wasn't there but heard about it for years afterwards.

At OGC it got so intense that shooters had to call the Match Director the Wed. night before the weekend match to reserve shooting slots. Many shooters had 3-4 guns that they used during a match. Every shooter had a spotter. Spotters were also shooters. So, one person would shoot while the other served as spotter. Then they traded places and the spotter shot while the other person spotted. Matches were always held on Sat. and Sun. State Championships were held Friday through Sunday.

Today, 2022, only two clubs host matches in Minnesota; OGC and Minnetonka. The intense interest has died down in recent years.

The oldest continuously running match event at OGC is NRA Bullseye/Conventional Pistol/2700 and the second oldest is handgun silhouette. OGC has hosted many IHMSA State Championships over the years.

I shot my first handgun silhouette match in 1979. My father spotted for me. Hitting and knocking over my first ram at 200-meters, using an iron sighted, 6" barreled S&W revolver and cast bullets, got me hooked! I became a Life Member of IHMSA in 1990 and might occasionally shoot matches today.

## WHAT IS THE POSTAL MATCH??

## POSTAL MATCH

The OGC Postal Match is great fun, gives shooters a goal to achieve as well as a reason to practice and improve his / hers shooting skills. The term "Postal" refers to the manner by which targets are exchanged, the US Mail. The Postal Match works like this;

Shooters choose only the events they want to participate in. Fee per event is \$5.00 and the deadline for entries is June 15, 2022.

The events are:

Handgun (Revolver) @ 10 Yards, open sights, timed fire.
Handgun (Autoloader) @ 10 Yards, open sights, timed fire.
Handgun (Rimfire) @ 10 Yards, open sights, timed fire.
Handgun Unlimited 100 Yards, any caliber, any sight.
Lever Action @ 100 Yards, scope, timed fire.
Lever Action @ 100 Yards, iron sights, timed fire.
Rimfire Rifle @ 100 Yards, scope, timed fire.
Rimfire Rifle @ 50 Yards, open/iron sights, timed fire.
Hunting Rifle (.270 Min Cal) @ 100 Yards, scope, timed fire.
Hunting Rifle (.270 Min Cal) @ 100 Yards, iron sights, timed fire.
Varmint Rifle @ 200 Meters, scope, timed fire.
Varmint Rifle @ 200 Meters iron sights, timed Fire
Black Powder Cartridge Rifle @ 200 yards. Scope, timed fire.

Once you have chosen your events and filled out the entry form, mail the form including fees (\$5.00 per event) to:

Your official Postal Match Targets and specific event rules will be mailed to you within 10 days. You have all summer to complete your events using the honor system. When you have completed your events, return the score targets, by US mail, to Don Nelson at the above address by September 15, 2022.

The top shooter in each event will receive his/her \$5.00 Grand Prize and, of course, have bragging rights knowing he or she is "TOP GUN" in the OGC Postal Match. In addition, the top competitor in each of the thirteen events will be recognized in the OGC Newsletter.
