#### Legislative Update: Bills Prohibiting Lead Ammunition Eric Osten, Legislative Director

There are two proposed bills prohibiting lead ammunition: MN HF3813 & SF3792

These companion bills have created a buzz among OGC members and rightfully so! The cost participating in high school trap would skyrocket and participation would surely diminish if lead projectiles were to be banned from HS sports

I contacted Bryan Strawser of the MN Gun Owners Caucus. He stated the following:

"These bills are currently sitting without a hearing and appear to not have leadership support to move forward. They were not heard in any committee in either house by last Friday's committee deadline, which means to move forward the rules would have to be waived which does happen).

*Rob Doar, our SVP, Government Relations, chatted with his NSSF counterpart today (03/25) and neither believe that these bills are going anywhere right now.* 

While no bill is ever truly dead until the legislature adjourns sine die in May, we don't see either of these bills having any momentum presently."

#### MN Gun Owners Caucus encourages OGC members to do the following:

- Get on your legislator's email lists
- Write and call your legislator and explain clearly why you are opposed to these bills - and ask them where they stand. Tell your legislators that we're their voice in Saint Paul if so willing.
- Goto any town hall, coffee chat, or other appearance by your legislators and let them know politely and directly where you stand in person — and keep going.

## 2024 Introduction to Firearms for Women

#### Public is Welcome!

Would you like to learn about handguns, rifles, and shotguns?

This 1 evening + 1-day informational workshop, taught by certified safety instructors, is a way for Women to get their basic questions about firearms answered in a safe, friendly, casual, women-only class-room environment. Note: Instructors are both Female and Male.

The workshop consists of one evening and one full day: evening is classroom discussion and Saturday morning is "hands on". Then experience an afternoon of live fire range time on Saturday afternoon.

18 years of age to take this class, unless accompanied by a parent or guardian. Other restrictions may apply.

The cost of this course is \$50.00 (includes: class materials, firearm rentals and ammo) and must be prepaid to hold your registration. The class is limited to 30 women on a first come basis.

## **Three Position Rifle Matches**

These matches help develop proficiency in firing for score in Sitting, Kneeling, and Standing positions. Any repeating rifle, rimfire or center fire, qualifies. There are no requirements or limitations to equipment. Any sight, any action, any modification is allowed.

The match comprises 50 rounds at 50 yards: 10 rounds each slow and rapid fire Sitting, 10 rounds slow fire Kneeling, and 10 rounds each slow and rapid fire Standing. Low velocity jacket or cast bullet reloads are suggested for reduced cost and recoil. Score your own targets. Rotate between different guns during the season if you wish.

2024 matches are May 1 &15, June 5 & 19, July 3 & 17, Aug. 7 (only 1 match this month), and Sept. 4 & 18. Open practice at 4:45 pm, match starts at 5:15 pm and lasts about an hour. Targets are supplied. Match fee is \$5.

In the event of inclement weather (rain or muddy conditions at the range because of rain), the match will be canceled. For more info about the match or cancellations, call Linda Ruffing (651) 731-1714 or Denis LaCroix (651) 488-2615.

## Precision Handloading at OGC

The club's BoD occasionally receives member inquiries wanting to learn about the extent of precision handloading that some of our members practice out at the club. There is no organized group that does this. Our club is well known as possibly the most diverse club in the area, considering all of the different shooting opportunities that are participated in @ the club. So there are some members who are "precision handloaders".

You'll notice they are referred to as "handloaders". Sometimes that term is replaced by "reloaders". But most reloaders don't dive into the pursuit of precision that handloaders do. In general reloaders round up the components.....cases, primers, powder, bullets....find a loading manual and just follow the recipe there. Nothing wrong with that but the distinction is handloaders scrutinize the recipe and ask "why not do this" and then they try it. "This" can include a whole bunch of variables!

Although there is no small group that meets to conduct and compare their handloading efforts, here are some examples of where precision handloaders are active @ the club. They are active in what is called competitive shooting matches.

CMP Military Rifle...many of the shooters are handloaders. They use commercial jacketed bullets and a few well-known powders that are

suited for use in an M-1 Garand. Some of the shooters can be seen shooting military surplus ammunition.


Scheutzen Rifle...the rules require the use of plain base cast bullets (no gas check allowed). This limits the muzzle velocity that can be used because cast bullets are not as durable as a factory jacketed bullet.

The rifles are often those made in the late 1880's and early 1900's, most of them are single shots or modern replicas of those. Scheutzen is a German or Swiss expression, going back to the mid 1880's. Back then they shot offhand (standing) @ 200-yards. In those days the matches were as much as social as they were shooting. Today @ OGC the matches are @ 100-yards, off hand and off the bench. Every shooter is a handloader and makes their own cast bullets.

CBA (Cast Bullet Assn.) Benchrest....the rules also require the use of cast bullets. There is one match gun category that does not allow the use of gas checks. All other gun categories allow the use of gas checks.

Gas checks allow the bullet to be shot at slightly faster muzzle velocities. Every shooter is a handloader and the majority cast their own bullets. However, some shooters purchase cast bullets. This is the event that I run @ OGC during the summer.

There are (9) different gun categories. Rather than break them all down here, if you have an interest, check out the Lyman 4th edition Cast Bullet Handbook. Lyman had me do a chapter in the book, focusing on the CBA gun categories and matches. And....if you want to try this event @ OGC, come on out with any gun and any ammunition. You can shoot with us, get a feel for the range commands and the course of fire. Be prepared to learn a lot about cast bullets and handloading practices as you visit with the other shooters.



IHMSA Handgun Silhouette... Here most of the shooters are handloaders. A few use cast bullets but the majority use commercial jacketed bullets. They, like all the other competitive shooters noted above, fine tune their handloads to their guns. All guns are different and a load that works good in one gun may not be the "best" load in a different "identical" gun.

The BoD is not suggesting that some kind of a club be organized

within the OGC club. If you were to ask some of the competitive shooters above about how they test their handloading efforts, many would say.....at a match!

One constant that many shooters experience is....."man, this load worked great during load testing but at the match is was a failure." Why? Welcome to variable city.

Could it be ...

- Two different weather days
- Different bench technique than load testing day...are you controlling recoil, grip, breathing, rifle/body contact points, follow through, etc. the same for every shot?
- Failure to read the wind....yes, wind blows bullets off course...windy one day but not the other?
- Shooter health was different each day

The conclusion? Go back to the loading bench and try harder! This is a hobby, and good results are the result of hard work and commitment, not chasing all of the gizmos that develop the perfect round of ammunition. The only thing that matters is what the target tells you.

#### What is the Postal Match?

The OGC Postal Match is great fun, gives shooters a goal to achieve as well as a reason to practice and improve his / hers shooting skills. The term "Postal" refers to the manner by which targets are exchanged, the US Mail. The Postal Match works like this;

Shooters choose only the events they want to participate in. Fee per event is \$5.00 and the deadline for entries is June 15, 2024.

#### The events are:

- •Handgun (Revolver) @ 10 Yards, open sights, timed fire.
- •Handgun (Autoloader) @ 10 Yards, open sights, timed fire.
- •Handgun (Rimfire) @ 10 Yards, open sights, timed fire.
- •Handgun Unlimited 100 Yards, any caliber, any sight.
- •Lever Action @ 100 Yards, scope, timed fire.
- •Lever Action @ 100 Yards, iron sights, timed fire.
- •Rimfire Rifle @ 100 Yards, scope, timed fire.
- •Rimfire Rifle @ 50 Yards, open/iron sights, timed fire.
- •Hunting Rifle (.270 Min Cal) @ 100 Yards, scope, timed fire.
- •Hunting Rifle (.270 Min Cal) @ 100 Yards, iron sights, timed fire.
- •Varmint Rifle @ 200 Meters, scope, timed fire.
- •Varmint Rifle @ 200 Meters iron sights, timed Fire
- •Black Powder Cartridge Rifle @ 200 yards. Scope, timed fire.

Your official Postal Match Targets and specific event rules will be mailed to you within 10 days. You have all summer to complete your events using the honor system. When you have completed your events, return the score targets, by US mail, to Don Nelson at the above address by September 15, 2024.

The top shooter in each event will receive his/her \$5.00 Grand Prize and, of course, have bragging rights knowing he or she is **"TOP GUN"** in the OGC Postal Match. In addition, the top competitor in each of the thirteen events will be recognized in the OGC Newsletter.



## The Bullet In - Newsletter Update

#### Jeff Hoch, Newsletter Director

Up until now I have spared you a '*From the Editor*' column. I was asked to provide background on the new fee since the minutes cannot convey the background effort this entailed. Costs have increased since my annual report in December.

In the minutes you will see the BOD accepted a recommendation from the Revenue Generating Committee to start charging a fee to recover the costs of the paper and postage. This was first proposed in January. I must admit I was not in favor of the idea but did take on a thoughtful review. I want to thank the committee for their task to recommend unpopular fee increases and cost reductions. Based on their thorough work across all budget items, the BOD has reduced costs and raised other fees including those to the public and even the high schools. The club is impacted by inflation, and we must act to keep the club thriving. It requires an effort to maintain non-profit status. In each of these changes we ask for your support.

Summary of direct newsletter costs on the club's financial books:

- Publishing and USPS mailing costs to approximately approx. 50 members: \$200 per month based on recent increases. The number being sent is too low to benefit from any bulk mailing options from USPS. These costs are for black & white. Color would be much more. We have never paid for color copies even when the printer did this.
  - 2024 projected to be over \$2,400 based on current costs and historical pages printed/number mailed.
  - 2023 Total costs were \$1,307 to print and mail paper copies.
- **Emailing** the newsletter: **\$39 per month total** to approx. **1,400 subscribers**. This cost includes all OGC emails and announcements. We have seen a recent increase, but our vendor (Intuit) is still price-competitive for the features we use.
- Labor costs: none. This is done with member volunteer hours. I average around 8 -10 hours a month for newsletter tasks. Pati Leo spends a few hours each month with the immediate request for printings and mailings. She goes over and above finding the best prices. Teresa and many others spend time writing articles to keep the newsletter relevant and keep us all informed. I wish I could quantify for you all the volunteer hours but cannot at this time.
- Software and computer costs for producing the newsletter: none. I use a personal copy of Microsoft Office on my home computer.

**Our Ask**: We encourage those receiving both electronic and postal to only receive electronic. We also encourage those only receiving paper to move to email version. Email also keeps you current with notices that come up during the month. We do not spam you. We average 3 emails per month.

**Future:** In the past few months, I have heard and implemented suggestions for improvement. Thank you for your input (even if I could not implement exactly as suggested). The board is discussing more shooting and general interest articles. Thank you, Tom Acheson, for taking the lead with this month's Handloader article.

This is where we need your help. We hope to move it beyond appearing to be a missive of the board. We know there are great stories out there. Please submit articles and pictures! Even those printed many years ago. Submit them to **newsletter@oakdalegunclub.org**. For those receiving this by USPS mail there is a subscription form to continue mailings.





## OGC Member Meeting - March 13, 2024

Meeting started at 7:00 PM by Vice President Austin Harris.

There were 20-members present.

Pledge was said.

**Secretary Report**: Duane made a motion to approve the minutes from the February 14 member meeting as written the in Newsletter. Second by Austin. Majority of those present voting aye. No opposed.

**Treasurer**: John presented the treasure report on the screen for everyone to read. He explained the report and for the first time the Bank, and QuickBooks balanced to the penny.

**Vice President report**: Austin, sign up hours for members are out by newsletter and email. Before mid-August the only openings left were lead trap positions. With the change to badges for the High Schools, there are no positions open for gate guards for them. There are openings for gate guards for novice trap and a couple of matches. If you have concern on getting time in you can contact Austin or others board members that have asked for assistance. Austin had a couple of things from President Bob Lawrence. Bob spoke with Clark Schroeder the interim Lake Elmo City admin and he stated they are aware of 87A the range protection act and they have no plans to harm the club. Also, the water for the school would be on Co Rd 17 and there are no plans to widen 10th street.

**GM Report**: Teresa, the gate guard positions filled up in a day. Valerie sent out info to the High Schools about the plan to used badges for the student's entry to the club. Austin also noted the gate was open today with no gate guards which leaves the club open to problems. Austin indicated Jack was working on the badges. He has no time line but maybe available next week. Teresa reported the Women's class is filling up. She ordered Trap birds and should be here April 29 with a cost of \$21,000. She has heard from members that the new trap birds are easier to see than the old ones. She was contacted by a couple of members that would like to give demo on making bullets on Saturday May 4 at 11:00 with no cost to the club. You can sign up with Teresa for the demo. **Motion** was made by John to allow demo on making bullets, seconded with majority of members present voting aye. The demo info will be in the newsletter.

#### Old Business:

**Bylaw Committee**: Eric, the committee is using info from past years by Michael and Duane to make changes. We are moving along with the changes and will present them at the September meeting and discuss them in the October meeting.

**Policy Committee**: Austin, Looked at first couple of pages of the policy manual. Made suggestions on changes. Plan is to make suggestions in the 1st meeting. The suggestions would be published in the newsletter and voted on at the next member meeting and then published when approved. Austin reported on the suggested changes and members need to look at the Newsletter for the actual new changes.

**Grant Committee**: Herb, presented a potential list of choices for grants. He cautioned on being careful of the spending that we don't get a problem like last year. There are items on the list that could reach \$50,000. He asked do we want to do that? Herb said we have choices we can scale it back or not do anything. MidwayUSA has objectives each year and we don't know what their objectives are. We want to try to make choices that MidwayUSA could agree with. It requires High School teams as one of the objectives MidwayUSA looks at. John asked about the ADA requirements that are needed and do we want to spend \$50 or \$25 thousand to do them. Member discussed the grants we have processed and the fact we have to match dollars in the grant. Member also indicated there are line-item vetoes on a grant that we could use in selecting what is done verses dollars spent. Any dollars not spent could be returned to MidwayUSA. Austin asked John if we had \$25,000 to spend on grants. Teresa reported there can be offsets based on revenue from the High School trap each year. Austin made a **mo-tion** to reserve \$25,000 on a \$50,000 grant with the understanding we could possibly spend less. Second by Valerie, majori-ty of members present voting aye. Herb added we could also have members with certified skills use their service hour on the projects in the grant and apply the hourly rate towards our part of the grant expense. Member, Tom, asked about drainage on the property and if this may cause damage to the club? Austin replied maybe not damage but range flooding limits its use. Austin then asked for a vote on the **motion** with majority present voting aye.

## OGC Member Meeting - March 13, 2024 (continued)

**Chief Instructor**: Dan, Austin reported Dan was out sick but there is a third new member class on March 27 with 23 members sign up to attend. Dan needs tour guides and members can apply service hours for on March 27. There likely will add another new member class in April. Duane and Jack will check the current list of new members that have not attended and invites will be sent for the April class.

**Revenue Committee**: Eric, Last meeting Dan indicated he would reply to the matrix they had created. Austin said he did not get it. Austin will check to see if there is something to publish in the newsletter.

**Public Hours**: Austin, presented a diagram of public hours on the screen for members to view. There will be 62 days open to public hours this year.

#### New Business:

**Gate rules**: Austin, High School teams will have badges to open the gate. Cost to the student is \$5.00. Will only be able to badge in during hours allotted for their team to shoot.

**Legislature ban on lead**: Legislature is proposing a ban on shooting lead. Eric will place an item on the Lead ban proposal. Member mentioned it would be great to bring in students to the capitol when the lead issue is discussed. Austin said despite rumors to the contrary, OGC is a single issue political club, with that issue being the 2nd amendment. We should voice our opinion to city council. H.F 3792 is the house file. Member said people should realize that lead does not leach into the ground. Duane spoke on a club member that tests the PH of the soil to ensure lead is encapsulated and does not get into the soil. That is why we cannot use bio-degradable birds that change the soil PH.

Member asked how many new members this year? Duane's count is 60 so far and there is 40 more on the list. Should be over 100 possible this year. Teresa indicated there is a problem Email address called CONTACT to change that goes nowhere. The one to use is called NEW MEMBER.

Other: Mark Schutte has donated more vests to the club for RSO use. Kudos to Mark for his donation.

**Range Improvement**: John G. this weekend will be improvements to the 100, 50 and possibly the comp ranges to install 2X4 on the target posts to stop ricochets. He has members that volunteered to help install them. An email will be sent out to note the range closure for the work. Also meeting with a contractor to get bid for prep work to install the storage container between the 100 and 200 range. He would like to get more bids before a decision is made. Member asked about chicken wire on the comp range. Now have to replace the whole strip of wire instead of small area replacement. Make a note to measure twice and cut small pieces for comp range wire replacement.

John indicated Minnesota Gun Owners Caucus rally is scheduled later this month at the Capitol. He would like to see an Email to club member to get out and support the 2nd amendment. Dean, Michael, and Herb responded to this issue. All want an Email to members to rally them to individually support the 2nd amendment and go to the caucus rally. Austin added a 2nd amendment issue is an OGC issue and also is a you and I issue. Michael L said be sure when you go to the legislature you know why you are there and have answers to questions of why you support the 2nd amendment and oppose the bill.

## OGC Board Meeting - March 13, 2024

Meeting started at 8:18 PM by Vice President Austin Harris.

There were 9 board members and the GM present.

A quorum of Board members was present.

**Secretary Report**: A **motion** was made to accept the minutes from the February 2024 Board meeting. John seconded; the minutes were approved as printed in the newsletter.

#### Old Business:

**High School badges**: Valerie informed the High Schools about the Badge reader program and the \$5.00 cost to the student. There was some grumbling by the coaches but the program will go ahead. Michael asked could we use the grant request to pay for the H.S. badges. Herb answered that MidwayUSA may not cover some expendables The Badge program is already started.

Joel and the coaches had meet last year on a meeting about offsetting the bird order. They talked about teams that had the means to prepay for the season shoot. Is that something we need at this point? John indicated he had heard about prepays and it would be a spread sheet item that they prepaid for trap. Teresa indicated there are different ways that the High Schools pay. She said she thought it is too late for this year. Maybe something could be set up for next year as budgets have already been set. Austin said this would be a topic for pre-payment in 2025.

**Grant Projects lists**: The list was on the screen. All the projects were listed. Teresa questioned the ramp on the east side of the Marah building. Herb said he added it because some of the matches serve food and that area is not assessable by wheel chair. Teresa indicated there is nowhere else to go as it is not assessable to any of the ranges. Other ways to help the wheel chair person could be done. Other questions about the lists were discussed. Valerie noted at other clubs there is a line marked with signage that Eye and Ear protection is required beyond this point. Signage will be looked at. Austin asked about the targets on the 25yard and using movable target stands. The Iron on the stands have been shot at and have holes. Dean indicated PVC pipes in the ground and 2X4 could fix that. Austin said there are no ranges for action shooting. By using movable stands only, the targets could be placed at different distance for action shoots and the 25yd is a good spot for that. John said PVC does not work for target stands as they fill with water and dirt and freeze in the winter. Austin also stated the 25yd has a problem with drainage. Herb said there is no place for the water to go and we need someone to create a drainage system on the 25yd out to the area where the archery range was. It would require significant work to drain it. Teresa added there is no room for large equipment to do it. Teresa cautions when open to the public she tells the public to not shoot on the left side of the range because ricochet can go over to the 200yd.

John indicated we could use some rubber on the target posts to fix that. Austin talked about removing the target stands and using the movable stands and making other stands. Austin also said we need to have people that use the target stands move them back when done. Austin noted that damage to OGC property is frequently caused by irresponsible conduct of some members. This includes damage to target stands as seen on the 25yd range and the roofs as seen on the short range. We are all stewards of OGCs property, your dues go to buying and maintaining it, so please treat it as you would your own items at home. It is requested that if you accidentally cause damage, you let us know so it may be fixed. We would prefer not to find out from other members after the fact. John spoke of problems of bad gun handling causing holes in the roof of the short range. Austin said one round leaving the range and hitting someone will close the Oakdale Gun club. Duane asked that we move on as time is short.

**Fee increase**: Austin made a **motion** to increase public shooting fee by \$2.00 and public trap my \$2.00 and member trap by \$1.00. Michael seconded with majority present voting aye. No opposed. Will take effect immediately.

**Newsletter mail fee**: Assess \$40 fee for member to receive paper newsletter via USPS. Jeff indicated over 57 members getting the mailed newsletter and some of them also receive by email. Jeff and Patty have been doing everything to keep the price down. After discission John indicated \$30.00 could be appropriate. There will be a notice in the mailed newsletter in April about the increase. After discussion Michael made a **motion** to add a \$40 fee to members who receive the mailed newsletter. Seconded with majority present voting aye. No opposed.

#### New Business:

**Drone Service**: Patrick Watson is looking to have his service hours for last year and this year and member fee done by using the Drone service for the club. He came before the board for his proposal. He talked about working with Gail last year and somehow missing his hours. He would like to make some updated videos and some updated photos for the club. These would include trap photos and modern rifles and deer rifles. He would like to use younger member models from the club to show how the club operates. He has a lot of ideas he wants to do. Would probably be about \$4800 worth of work for him in exchange for last year's hours, this year's hours and renewal fee. Michael made a **motion** to approve, seconded majority present voting aye. No opposed. Austin made a **motion** to make Patrick the official photographer and Drone photographer for the club. Michael spoke of the current release all members sign and maybe something could be added for photos. Michael indicated we as a club have to do more marketing for the club. Austin would like to update a policy for drones at the club. Austin made a **motion** that Drone pilots must obtain Board permission from the club and follow all state and Federal guidelines. Austin will take this on.

#### Meetings

Members are encouraged to attend club meetings. General membership meetings are on the second Wednesday of the month in the classroom unless otherwise noted. Board meetings are on the second Wednesday of the month following the member's meeting. Any member may attend a Board meeting to observe. To be on the agenda members need to contact the President and request time. Any member may attend a Board meeting to observe and comment during open comment period. Open comment time limits will be stated by the board at the beginning of the meeting. Only board members may vote at board meetings. Members may contact the President to request to be on the agenda.

OGC holds an annual meeting in December with a presentation of annual reports, election of Board members for the upcoming year and vote on By-Law changes. Previous Board Member terms end and new Board Member terms start at the conclusion of the annual meeting.

#### Club Policies

Club policies will be maintained in the Member Handbook. In exceptional circumstances, when failure to act could cause immediate harm or risk to the club, the Board of Directors may develop and implement a new policy. temporary policy pending investigation and member vote at a regular member meeting. #### Ranges and Facilities

13. Short Range – members range – This range is limited to handguns, pistol caliber carbines, and rim fire rifles only. No centerfire-rifles rifle caliber firearms or shotguns allowed. Targets are portable and may be moved forward for those wishing to "shoot short" (minimum of 10 feet)

15. Archery Range – For safety reasons, the area previously used for archery is closed for any archery activity until further notice. This area is part of the DNR Hunter Safety field day activity.

#### **Oakdale Gun Club Confidential Information Policy**

Oakdale Gun Club Confidential Information Policy for Board of Directors and all Oakdale Gun Club Membership.

It is the policy of the Oakdale Gun Club that all club membership will not disclose confidential information belonging to, or obtained through their affiliation with, the Oakdale Gun Club to any person outside of membership, or any business and professional associates, unless the Oakdale Gun Club has authorized disclosure. This policy is not intended to prevent disclosure where disclosure is required by law.

Preservation of privileged information: Board members and all club membership shall not divulge, transmit or distribute any confidential or proprietary information outside of the club's membership without Oakdale Gun Clubs authorized disclosure. The following indicates important confidential and proprietary information. This policy may be updated to cover additional information deemed confidential and proprietary. This policy will reside in the Member Handbook.

Bylaws are considered a legal document that dictates how the organization must be governed thus are a confidential document of the club.

The club's financial, legal and security information, insurance policies, tax documents, member issues/discipline, employee records/compensation, the contents of the membership E-Bulletin/Newsletter which contains board and member meetings, contact lists, project info and firearm sales, all policy and procedural manuals, the member handbook, project plans, and contracts.

Marketing tools such as the club's website, club brochures and classroom materials are intended for public viewing and not considered confidential info of the club.




